What Are We Doing In Lessons?

- Following completion of the R082 Digital graphics unit, we are practising more exam questions based on R081 content as 'Do Now' starters to lessons. This is useful retrieval practice for them.
- We are teaching the exam unit – Pre-production skills.

Topics

Your child has been learning a range of creative media skills which can be transferred between a range of careers, such as research, planning and reviewing. Your child has been learning through both theory and hands-on practical activities. The units are as follows:

R081

Exam—Pre Production Skills (Current Unit)

Planning is an essential part of working in the creative and digital media sector. This unit will enable you to learn the knowledge and skills needed to create digital media products. This will include learning about storyboarding, camera angles, visualisation diagrams and various other planning documents.

In this unit you are studying and practicing for their exam on the **9th January**.

R082

Coursework—Creating Digital Graphics (Completed)

The aim of this unit is to understand the basics of digital graphics editing for the creative and digital media sector. You will learn where and why graphics are used and how to create them.

You will be expected to plan, make and evaluate a cover for a DVD.

R085

Coursework—Creating Multimedia Webpages (Completed)

This unit will enable you to understand the basics of creating websites.

You will choose a scenario and create a functional, intuitive and aesthetically pleasing website.

R091

Coursework—Design a Game Concept

In this unit you will learn about the evolution of the gaming generations, from the early days of Pong to the current generation of Xbox One and PlayStation 4.

You will create a range of original ideas for a new game.

Top 5 Most Common Mistakes From The November Mock Exam:

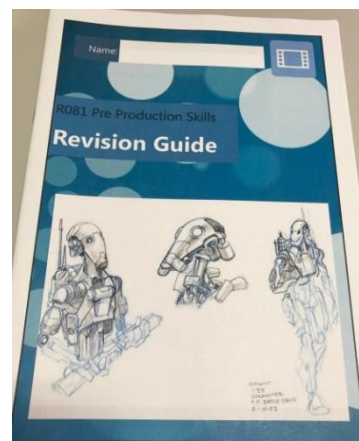
1. Not understanding what the question is asking them to do
2. Using the incorrect terms for the topic, resulting in no marks being awarded.
3. Not 'assessing' or 'evaluating' in the 8 and 12 mark questions.
4. Not developing definitions enough to get the third mark out of three.
5. Misspelling key words, many of which should have been correct as the word is featured in the question.

What Can You Be Doing At Home?

- Ensure your child is completing practice exam questions and revision.
- Flashcards of facts and information.
- Quizzing your child on key pre-production documents.
