What makes the difference at Parent's Evening?

Parent's evenings are important because they give you an opportunity to discuss what and how your child is doing at school.

You can also cover any issues you may want to talk about with your child's subject teachers. So going to parent's evenings can help you to become better involved in your child's learning. It helps you to give your child good, practical support and to make choices. When schools and parents work together, children do better.

Parent evenings give you an opportunity to ask questions and share information about your child and their learning. Sometimes parents can find it difficult to attend parents evenings for a number of reasons, we are working at these to make Parent's Evening a positive experience for all.

BEFORE:

Discuss with your child which subjects they feel happiest with; if there are any areas they feel concerned about or positives they would like you to raise.

Ask how they feel they are doing in each of their subjects in terms of effort and how they are progressing. By asking the same of the teachers you will have the information to compare and be able to identify potential gaps

Some questions to ask:

Are there any areas of your subject that my child is struggling with or excelling at?

Is there anything I can do at home in your subject to support my child?

Is their progress in line with their targets?

What grade should my child be aiming to achieve in this subject?

Is the homework being completed?

Are they up to date with their work?

What % of their final mark will be an examination and is there any controlled assessment?
