Pupils have entered this academic term in full swing! This term has yet again been packed with exciting events and experiences. This includes the Prison Me No Way workshops and talks in which the Year 9's and GCSE Sociology groups (which I myself had the pleasure of taking part of) learnt about the effects of crime on a person's life and on personal safety in a number of different scenarios.

The day was highly enriching, and it was fascinating to link the sociological theories to understand what motivated criminals to do crime.

Another highlight of this term would be the series of National Careers week activities that took place for pupils across all year groups. This included Into University that delivered talks and activities, a Careers Fair, Wyke interviews (that many of us Year 11's were anticipating for) and a visit from Kathryn Burn, a finalist on the 2022 series of The Apprentice!

A key event of this week would be the House Enterprise Challenge that took place over lunchtime, in which 18 stalls were able to sell a range of goods, from home-made cakes to origami frogs, to a plethora of pupils, teachers and visitors of Malet! It was fantastic to see so many pupils participate and experience being an entrepreneur, with many pupils turning a large profit for their efforts.

I am delighted to announce that my team had successfully made a profit of £126 from selling handmade jewellery; an extraordinary feat from just a single lunchtime! Well done to all the teams who took part, and everyone involved showed great entrepreneurial ability and spirit.

It is also great to see that our Extra Malet programme is still going strong! Special mentions to the Geography Champions Club, Mr Farr's Journalism club and the various revision sessions set up by staff over lunchtime. In particular, the contributions to LGBTQ+ club joining with history club with the aim to educate pupils on LGBTQ+ history month in February has been a very busy project.

There are new displays in the history corridor which will exhibit these pupils' pieces on key historical LGBTQ+ figures and how they helped create change today and for future generations.

Citizens UK project

For the past year, Malet pupils have been involved with the Citizens UK project on tackling the issue of sexual harm and harassment in and around our school communities. Although this unfortunately affects people of all genders, this behaviour is notoriously targeted towards young females in particular.

Citizens UK is a national programme involving over a hundred schools and policy decision makers where young people from all over the UK are working together to discuss the main issues and potential solutions for sexual harassment.

Diversity

This term, I had the pleasure of delivering an assembly on celebrating diversity to help tackle discrimination in school and going over the Challenge It campaign with the help of the Head Pupils.

The core aims of the film are to raise visibility of LGBT+ people, particularly at LGBT+ History Month (February) and raise awareness about historical and current progress and challenges.

After a PLT meeting with the trust with core members of the PLT we met with other pupil leadership teams across different schools to talk about one particular topic - diversity.

Professional speaker Jo Brassington educated us on what diversity means.

Smoke Free Generation

This term, Freya and I had the honour of visiting the Houses of Parliament to discuss with politicians their plans on creating a Smoke Free Generation, meaning that children turning 15 this year will never legally be sold tobacco.

Smoking damages and cuts short lives in extraordinary numbers, with up to 64,000 people dying every year due to smoking related illness. Smoking causes 1 in 4 cancers in the UK and is responsible for just over 70% of all lung cancer deaths. As part of this, we had the opportunity to interact with high profile MP's and listened to the stories of smoking survivors and how tobacco has impacted their lives. Following this, we hope to deliver an assembly to the whole pupil body regarding the dangers of smoking and vaping.

The PLT amongst other pupils have been attending Citizens UK meetings along with other schools and their pupil leaders to discuss ways in which we can help prevent sexual harm and harassment in school, and to educate young people at an early age on the subject and how it impacts people in order to help prevention.

These are a series of meetings that you can take part in to fight for societal change and you can talk to Miss Ridley for more information on this matter.

Diversity relates to people from a range of different social and ethnic backgrounds and of different genders, sexual orientations, etc.

We educated pupils on the British Values to back up how we should not just tolerate but respect one another, and also highlighted the 2010 Equality Act to ensure we all know the characteristics protected under this law and that it has been made illegal to discriminate against these.



Smoke Free Generation

Our Head Pupils visit Westminster to assist in creating a smoke free generation and tackling youth vaping. Malet Lambert Head pupils, Freya and Selina, were invited to The Houses of Parliament on Wednesday 13th March to attend an event supporting the government's proposals to raise the legal smoking age gradually with the aim to create a smokefree generation.

Smoking tobacco has been linked to a quarter of all cancer related deaths, and the related health care burden can cost the economy billions of pounds a year.

Under these proposals, the age of sale for tobacco products will be raised by one year each year to prevent future generations from ever taking up smoking, as there is no safe age to smoke. The subject of vaping was also a hot topic. Under the government's plan, young people who are turning 15 this will never be able to purchase tobacco products.

These changes would be brought in alongside a commitment to make smoking alternatives, such as vaping, unappealing to young people. Earlier this term, our PLT ran

a survey with pupils to gather their thoughts and opinions on smoking and the related concerns. Freya and Selina took the results of this survey with them to London, as evidence of the position of the young people in our community.

"We saw and interacted with people such as Karl Turner (MP for Hull East) and Keir Starmer (Leader of the Labour Party) and listened to some harrowing stories from smoking survivors. Thank you to everyone who took part in the PLT survey as we used this to reflect the voices of the young people in Hull."
