A free event for students (15-18) – the Virtual University Open Day Futures Fest – will be held on 26th & 27th May – it is an opportunity to find out more about university life, finance, accommodation, and personal statement tips. With over 70 UK universities attending, it should help students to make their university choices.

Event information:

- The free online event takes place on 26th and 27th May.
- The event is aimed at 15-18 year olds thinking about going to university.
- Students will be able to watch content from current university students, find out useful information about every UK university, and ask any questions they may have about university life.

The Waterline Student Challenge - register by 28th May 2021

National Citizenship Service - Tigers Trust

The NCS programme offers young people, aged 16-17, a once in a lifetime opportunity to do something meaningful with their summer break, as well as a chance to develop skills and take on new challenges that will set them up for adult life.



They'll also do something good for their local community, carrying out a project to support a cause they care about.

Over a period of 2 or 3 weeks, participants will;

- Meet new people
- Try new things
- Give back to their local community through voluntary action
- Take on new challenges
- Develop the skills and confidence to take on their next steps
- Generate experience for their university application, job / apprenticeship interview or CV and more!

A place on NCS is worth around £1500. However, they only ask for a contribution of £50 to cover some basic costs.

Summer start dates:

- 12th July- (3 week programme including 1 week away residential)
- 26th July (3 week programme including 1 week away residential)
- 9th August (2 week programme- Non Residential)
- 16th August (2 week programme- Non Residential)
