Construction Commences

Work has now begun on a major extension to Malet Lambert.

This year, construction began on the planned extension to our sports building. The building work is being carried out as part of a city-wide investment of £50,000,000 to increase pupil places, choice and provide outstanding learning environments for pupils.

Along with a brand new, additional, indoor sports hall to be used as a multi-purpose area, the extension will also see the creation of five new classrooms to accommodate the growing cohort at Malet Lambert.

The work is set to be completed by August 2022, to be ready for the beginning of the new term in September. The work will also include some improvements to the adjacent car park, including new charging ports for electric vehicles.

Pupils produce video on deaf awareness

Pupils at Malet Lambert create an informative presentation focusing on deaf awareness.

A group of pupils with hearing impairments have collaborated to create a presentation designed to inform fellow pupils and staff on the struggles that deaf and hard of hearing pupils face day-to-day at school and how they can better improve their relationships with these pupils for the future.

The presentation gives its viewers a comprehensive overview of the common causes of deafness as well as the types of hearing aids that hard of hearing or deaf pupils may be using.

The information was researched and put together by a team of six pupils consisting of Kayleigh H (Year 8), Jake M (Year 10), Ellie H (Year 11) and Isaac T (Year 9), and also brilliantly presented by both Luke E (Year 11) and Emily W (Year 11).

While the video covers important statistics and numbers about the proportion of people in our communities who may have a level of hearing loss, the pupils are also sure to offer helpful advice on etiquette and how to better communicate with deaf or hard of hearing pupils.

Well done to all of the pupils involved in the production of this presentation.

Premier League Inspires

Year 11 Pupils Receive Their Mock Results

After weeks of hard work and dedicated revision, Year 11 pupils at Malet Lambert received their mock GCSE exam results this term.

The mock examinations help to give pupils an understanding of the exam process. During the mock exam period, pupils received similar direction to what they can expect during their exams in summer.

This includes taking their exams in the same conditions that they can expect to experience for their final exams. The mock results also give pupils an idea of the level that they are currently working at and can provide an idea on how to improve their exam performance in time for their summer exams.

They can also shine a light on certain areas of a subject that the pupil can see may need closer attention and additional revision.

Malet Lambert would like to congratulate our Year 11 pupils for all of their hard work during their mock GCSE exam period. We hope that this level of hard work can carry on into the summer term for the final GCSE exams.

As always, if a pupil would like to discuss any concerns they may have on their subjects leading up to the exams, they are encouraged to speak to their subject teacher for guidance.

Post-GCSE Education Fair

On the same day that Year 11 pupils collected their mock GCSE exam results, Malet Lambert welcomed a number of post-secondary education providers to offer information and advice to our pupils, on their options for after their summer exams.

Visitors included representatives from local Sixth Form Colleges, as well as apprenticeship providers. Pupils were able to enquire about courses, pathways and prospects beyond their GCSEs.

With their recently received mock GCSE exam results, pupils were in a better position to ask more specific questions on the options available to them, and in turn give themselves an idea of targets they may have to meet to reach the course or pathway of their choosing.

As always, our pupils are welcome to discuss their options for when they leave Malet Lambert with our Careers Leader, Ms Powell.

Our Careers provision can offer advice to pupils on the options available to them upon completing their exams.

They can also point them towards relevant and informative resources to better help them when considering their future pathways.



Holocaust Memorial Day



HOLOCAUST MEMORIAL DAY 27/1

In January, Malet Lambert marked Holocaust Memorial Day with a series of dedicated lessons for our key stage three pupils.

The 27th January is observed annually to commemorate the memory of those killed during the holocaust.

Supported by University College London's Centre for Holocaust Education, schools across the country take part in lessons and activities that focus on the historical context and affects that the horrific event continues to have to this day.



Pupils and staff were invited to make and write pledges on how they can help tackle antisemitism.

At the end of the last academic year, Malet Lambert was awarded the status of being a Beacon School for Holocaust Education by UCL.

The status means that Malet Lambert is recognised as showing a willingness to help improve teaching standards, raise pupil achievement and strengthen spiritual, moral, social and cultural (SMSC) provision across our year groups.

A special focus was made this year on the theme of "One Day". Pupils were asked to consider what they could pledge or commit to help tackle antisemitism in today's world.

The message of importance on learning about the Holocaust was clear to our pupils, who understood what lessons we can all take away from days like Holocaust Memorial Day.

Malet Lambert pupils were introduced to a number of topics in relation to the Holocaust. Lessons included a session delivered to Year 7 pupils about the story of Bob Rosner, who came over to the UK and was rehomed in Hull as part of the group of children rescued by the Kindertransport from Austria.

Year 8 pupils were shown the personal story of Steven Frank and his granddaughter Maggie, as they retraced Steven's journey from Amsterdam to Terezin in the Czech Republic.

Year 9 focused on the continuing issue of antisemitism in today's world and how it still affects the Jewish community to this day.

Year 7 pupil Poppy found herself surprised at the effect the antisemitism and Holocaust had on the well-being and education of the children in the affected areas.

"Today, I learnt about the kids and how it affected them and how they had to move because their education was cut off."

While Year 8 pupil Ben was surprised by how far reaching the events of the Holocaust were.

"I learnt about how far it was around Europe, how many places. I thought it was only a couple but there was quite a lot of them."

Miss Norman, Malet Lambert's Lead Teacher of Holocaust education, felt that the pupils had shown a tremendous level of engagement during the day and their lessons.


