Malet Lambert's Holocaust Memorial project

The Holocaust project was one that focused on many things, but above all, sharing stories. We hoped to learn more about Holocaust victims and help the victims' voices to be heard loud and clear.

During the project, students would get together and write poems, create display boards and artwork, and follow closely the story of Robert and Angela Rinder. We also created a timeline and display to feature in the forum!

The trip to London was educational, joyful and way too warm. Students took part in workshops that focused on Treblinka, which was an extermination camp used by the Nazis during the war. There was the opportunity to view images and maps of the camp and delve deeper into its tragic history, and to much surprise, Robert Rinder was a special guest on the trip!

He spoke from the heart and shared many inspirational words regarding his story and his family.

Many got involved due to a keen interest in history and some even had familial ties to the Holocaust and wanted to learn more about their history. Overall, it was truly educational and it has helped us all develop compassion and empathy for the world around us.

Diversity

In year 8, our PSHE curriculum teaches the importance of tackling hate crimes, in particular Islamophobia. Pupils have important discussions in class about what it is, how it effects and how we can prevent it.

At Malet Lambert, we celebrate diversity. November, in particular, is Islamophobia Awareness Month. However, some may be asking themselves why this is important to us at Malet. Let's begin with talking about what Islamophobia is. The Oxford dictionary definition for Islamophobia is, *"a hatred or prejudice towards Muslims."*

Here at Malet this isn't acceptable or tolerated but that doesn't mean is doesn't plague other parts of the world. This year's theme is 'Tackling Denial.' Many Muslims have to fight to simply be noticed in society because Islamaphobic people refuse to accept Muslims.

Christmas Foodbank Collection



A huge thank you to Malet Lambert pupils and staff who kindly contributed so many items to support our foodbank collection. The winter period can prove to be a difficult time for many in our community, and it is the school's hope that donations such as this can help alleviate some of the pressure that so many are facing in these times. We at the school were taken aback from the amount of donations received from pupils. All items will be donated to the Hull Unity Shop foodbank, where they will support many families this Christmas.



When will this stop? IAM's goal is to raise awareness for Islamophobia in social and political places through their campaign. This campaign intends to educate people on the religion itself but also the effect Islamophobia has on Muslims. It can leave Muslims isolated and selfloathing with poor mental health, which is why this must stop!

Research has found that Muslim men are 76% less likely to be employed than a white man. IAM's vision is to educate the world on all the good Muslim's contribute to society and to help people understand Islam because they deserve a place in this society.

In the RS curriculum, in Year 7 we cover Islam in the summer term, as part of learning about the three Abrahamic faiths. We also learn further about Islam within the GSCE curriculum, when studying different ethical themes. Malet Lambert pupils have taken part in a number of trips and visits over the first term of the year. Trips out of school offer pupils a chance to enrich their learning with practical and fun experiences.

Earlier this term, Year 11 Photography pupils visited the Hull Artist Research Initiative (HARI) to see the latest work by local Photographer, Chris G Smith. A project entitled "Enthusing Young Minds".

Pupils also contributed to the project when they were invited to produce their own work briefs, which were then fulfilled by Chris and other contributing photographers.

The Year 11 pupils also fulfilled the briefs themselves, allowing them to compare the different interpretations of the same tasks.

Trips and Visits

Also this term, Year 10 pupils attended a performance of A Christmas Carol as part of the English Department's trip to Hull New Theatre.

We look forward to all of the trips and visits being planned for the new year, including a trip to the Grand Opera House in York and Malet Lambert's annual ski trip in the Spring.
