

This term has seen a number of trips taking place for Malet Lambert pupils.

In June, our History department took a group of our Year 10 pupils to London. During the trip, the pupils visited amazing places such as the Imperial War Museum, the Tower of London and the London Dungeons.

In July, our Year 10 GCSE Geography pupils went to York to put practice the Human Geography fieldwork and research skills that they had been developing in class. The pupils spent their time surveying the nearby area and interviewing members of the public.

Also this term, a group of Year 8 pupils visited the Holocaust Centre and Museum, where they met and listened to Holocaust survivor, Hedi Argent.

On all of the aforementioned trips, the pupils conducted themselves incredibly well, and were all brilliant representatives of the school.

This year, pupils had the opportunity to partake in a wide range of activities including African drumming, street dancing, bracelet making, African Dancing, animation and photography.

After taking part in their chosen activity, pupils were required to review and evaluate their experience, as well as take part in a "skill share" where they were asked to show and demonstrate their new skills to fellow pupils.

These workshops follow on from an experience earlier this year, when pupils were invited to watch a performance of Alice in Wonderland as part of their qualification to experience the different artistic mediums.

Malet Lambert's Year 7 Girls rugby team emerge victorious at the Inspire Sport National Champions final.

The team set off for the final fixture in Newcastle to face off against Archbishop Sentamu Academy on Frida 7th July. Despite the long trip up to the final, the team was enthused and ready to play their best rugby against the opposition for the afternoon kick off.

The competition proved to be tough in the first half, with Archbishop Sentamu scoring throughout and bringing the score at half time to 14 -12 in their favour.

But it was during the second half when Malet Lambert was able to gain the lead, with a succession of tries and conversions, bringing the final score to 40-18 to Malet Lambert.

It wasn't just the Year 7 team that has had a successful season. The Year 9 Girls Rugby team had also managed to



reach their national final and were pitted against Castleford Academy.

Throughout both halves, Malet tried valiantly and made some great strides to advance up the pitch. Sadly, the opposition was incredibly strong, meaning that Malet Lambert ended their championship run at the respectable second place positon, losing to Castleford 20-0.

Both of our teams played exceptionally well and the school is immensely proud of them for both reaching their respective finals.

Hull Active Schools Sports Award

It was a successful evening at the Hull Active schools Secondary School Sports Awards this month.

The ceremony, which was held at Jubilee Central in the city centre, takes place annually to celebrate pupil/student achievements related to physical education, physical activity and school sport from across Hull. Winners from Malet Lambert included both Year 9 and Year 7 Girls Rugby teams, who have both had recent success in their respective finals.

Individual awards that were won by Malet Lambert pupils included the Key Stage 3 Sportswoman of the year title, awarded to year 7 pupil, Maria E. The award for Key Stage 4 Sportswoman of the Year went to Year 9 pupil, Betsy C. Also recognised was year 7 pupil, Noah L, who came away with the Key Stage 3 Inclusion Sportsperson of the year award.



It wasn't just our pupils whose achievements were recognised during the awards ceremony. Malet Lambert's PE department won two awards alongside the pupils. Mr Thornham won the PE Staff Member of the year award and Mr Ripley received the School Sport Lifetime Achievement Award.

Malet Lambert pupils enjoyed their reward day at this year's Malet Fest. Qualifying pupils were treated to the opportunity to spend some of their day out on the field, with a range of fun activities and treats, as a reward for their conduct over the last school year.

Pupils were able to qualify for the reward by maintaining a good level of attendance and behaviour throughout the year.

Some of the activities on offer were a range of inflatables including a giant slide, obstacle course, human table football and a bungee race. Also available for pupils to enjoy were a chance to meet and feed alpacas and speak to members of the emergency services and see some of the equipment and vehicles that they use in their day to day jobs.

This term saw the entire school come together for Malet Lambert's annual Sports Day. The yearly day of competition sees the six school houses compete to gain points in a wide range of sports and events, with the winning house taking the House trophy for the year.

The day began with the field events, with pupils taking 3rd Eagle – 547 points part in shotput, discus, javelin, long jump, triple jump and 2nd Chevron – 583 points some early track events.
