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# From our Headteacher

I am writing in regard of our recent Section 5 Ofsted inspection. This was a full re-inspection (sometimes called a full or graded inspection rather than a short or ungraded inspection.) This took place on 4th and 5th October 2023, and resulted in Malet Lambert being judged as good in all areas.



The inspectors that visited Malet Lambert carried out their inspection activities over the two days. The inspection included detailed analysis of various subject areas, visits to lessons, discussions with staff, pupils and governors, as well as meetings with school leaders. Additionally, they conducted scrutiny of work undertaken by our pupils. They reviewed various documentation provided by the school.

I am delighted that the hard work of all pupils, staff, parents and governors has paid off and we want to take this opportunity to thank our entire community for the support you have shown to Malet Lambert in recent years. The pupils were an absolute credit to us.

We are very proud that the Ofsted report reflects that Malet Lambert is a school that 'has great ambition for all pupils, to give them the best possible life chances in the future.' We were delighted that Ofsted commented that 'most pupils feel happy and safe at this school; and that they behave well in lessons and as they walk around the school.'We were also pleased to hear that our staff feel valued and are proud to work at the school. Crucially, we are pleased that Ofsted agreed that our arrangements for safeguarding are effective.

Although we are obviously delighted by the outcome of the Ofsted inspection, we are not complacent. We continue to be ambitious for all of our pupils and are determined to ensure that we continue to move forward. So, although we are very pleased with this outcome, we will be quickly getting on with the job of ensuring that all of our pupils enjoy the very best possible education and experiences during their time with us. We will also be making further plans to some of the developmental areas that Ofsted has outlined.
