### Green Careers Week - 6th November - 11th November

This week is Green Careers Week (GCW), which **celebrates and highlights careers that have links to sustainability and the environment**. Green Careers Week is an exciting event that raises aspiration, supports diversity, challenges stereotypes, and promotes real opportunities for young people to have a career that will genuinely make a difference.

A green career can be any job, role or occupation that contributes to preserving or restoring the environment and our planet. It can be any industry, not just those seen as 'green.' Green skills are abilities, attributes, values, attitudes, knowledge, and technical skills needed to adapt services, processes and procedures to support climate change.

## Anti-Bullying Week 13th-17th November 2023

As a school, we are working with the Anti-Bullying Alliance to raise awareness of Bullying issues. Odd Socks Day is part of Anti-Bullying Week! To celebrate that we are all unique, we ask that you wear odd socks to school on Monday 13th November. All other elements of your child's uniform must still comply with the uniform policy, however the "odder" and brighter the socks, the better!

As part of Anti-Bullying Week, we are running a competition to design a sock with the theme 'Make Some Noise'. Every pupil who enters the competition will receive 10 Plus Points with prizes awarded to the top 3 entrants. Pupils can collect the template from the Library and should give their design to Mrs Hutchinson.

Over the next few weeks, pupils will also have an assembly around Bullying. The focus of these will be around understanding the term 'Banter', and when comments no longer become funny to others. Throughout the year, pupils will gain a broader understanding of healthy relationships through their PSHE lessons also.

There are many different ways that your child can speak to us if they are worried about friendship issues or concerned about Bullying. They can do this by speaking to their tutor, their house team or any trusted member of staff in school. If they do not feel comfortable verbally communicating this with us, we also have the PAWS app. Students can access this from our school computers and through RM Unify at home. This sends an alert to their House team who will then be able to speak to them in confidence.

If you do have any concerns about your child, please contact their tutor or house team in the first instance. All of their email addresses can be found on the school website.

### Youth Support Services - Pupils Aged 13+

Once our pupils reach Year 9, we pass pupil information to our local authority and / or provider of youth support services as they have responsibilities in relation to the education or training of 13-19 year olds under section 507B of the Education Act 1996. This enables them to provide services as follows:

- youth support services
- careers advisers

A parent or carer can object to any information in addition to their child's name, address and date of birth being passed to their local authority or provider of youth support services by informing us via email to <a href="mailto:enquiries@maletlambert.hull.sch.uk">enquiries@maletlambert.hull.sch.uk</a>. This right is transferred to the child / pupil once they reach the age 16. Data is securely transferred to the youth support service via encrypted email and is stored electronically and held for in accordance with the local authorities retention schedule.
